

Since the coronavirus, Mission Action has been hard at work helping, serving, and resourcing the community. We know the work is not done, and we will continue to serve in the best ways we can, but here are a few updates on how your money is being spent:

- 1. Mission Action provided 273 breakfasts during the week for 39 homeless WARM guests who are staying at the Days Inn.**
- 2. Rent and air conditioners continue to be bought for community members.**
- 3. Work was completed to build a ramp for a handicapped senior citizen in partnership with Shenandoah Heights Baptist.**
- 4. Donation Drive of School Supplies for August and September. Bring donations to worship with you and Janis will take them for you.**
- 5. Disciples Kitchen Meal Team cooked as well as delivered essential goods bags to the homeless in Basic City**
- 6. \$200 sent to Salvation Army for school toolbox supplies**
- 7. Thousands of dollars keep going out to those in our community in need.**
- 8. Over 200 additional masks were made and sent to VPAS as they start to resume some activities as well as for their drivers.**
- 9. During COVID, the Bread Ministry has delivered food to low-income families every weekend from Panera. Thank you to all who serve in this great ministry and a special thanks to Charles and Anne Salambier for spearheading it.**
- 10. Funds are used weekly for families affected by COVID in the community from our Fellowship Fund.**
- 11. Mission Action donated \$500 to the Boys and Girls Club to help with their kitchen repair following a fire.**
- 12. Purchased materials (thanks to a \$1000 grant from the BGAV) to make Protective Masks for Augusta Health, VPAS, and Waynesboro Schools.**
 - 1. To date, we have made over 1000 masks!**
- 13. Donated hundreds of previously purchased hygiene items to United Way to make hygiene kits for the community.**
- 14. Donated \$500 to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship's Coronavirus Relief Fund to support global initiatives of relief and care**
- 15. Donated \$500 to the National Honor Society to shop for seniors**
- 16. Moved three months of the Valley Pastoral Counseling Center's rent into their Client Assistance Fund to support mental health needs**
- 17. Donating \$136 to WARM for 34 community members to do laundry**
- 18. Purchasing \$1000 worth of school supplies and Christian education materials for low-income families for three apartment complexes**
- 19. Donated \$1200 in partnership with the YMCA to help families**
- 20. Staffing Disciples Kitchen three days/week in partnership with Westminster Presbyterian**
- 21. Collecting donations of Hand sanitizer, preferably Ecolab Nourishing Foam (but other brands/types will be appreciated); Hand soap, preferably Scott Antimicrobial Foam Skin Cleanser (but other brands/types will be appreciated) Disposable gloves – non-latex for Augusta Health**
